

# COVID 19 DETAIL PREVENTION CONCEPT

FOR THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THE

## of the INTERNATIONAL OPEN WATER STATE, JUNIOR and MASTER CHAMPIONSHIPS 2021 in SWIMMING

ON AUGUST 6/7, 2021 AT LAKE HECHTSEE

This prevention concept is based on the 278th Ordinance of the Federal Minister of Social Affairs, Health, Long-Term Care and Consumer Protection enacting the Ordinance on Further Opening Steps with Regard to the COVID-19 Pandemic (2nd COVID-19 Opening Ordinance - 2nd COVID-19 Ordinance and 1st Amendment to the 2nd COVID-19 Opening Ordinance) BGBl. II. No. 278 /2021, which is valid from 1 July 2021 and must be observed without restriction.

### 1. General

- 1.1. This COVID-19 detailed prevention concept was created as a supplement to the COVID-19 prevention concept of the Austrian Swimming Federation.
- 1.2. Adherence to this concept and compliance with the house rules are mandatory.
- 1.3. The physician responsible for the creation of the concept is Dr. Birgit Angel.
- 1.4. Due to local conditions or official requirements, changes may be made to this concept at short notice. These will then be announced immediately.

### 2. COVID 19 Prevention Officer

- 2.1. For the championships Renate Freisinger will be assigned as COVID-19 prevention officer. (From the beginning of the event until 10 days after the end of the event),

### 3. Evidence of a low epidemiological risk

- 3.1. At the outset, evidence of a low epidemiological risk must be demonstrated by each athlete and person involved in the event. For this apply:

- 3.1.1. Evidence of a negative result from a SARS-CoV-2 antigen test for self-testing that is recorded in a regulatory data processing system and that was taken no more than 24 hours ago,
  - 3.1.2. proof from an authorized body of a negative result of an antigen test for SARS-CoV-2, which must have been taken no more than 48 hours previously (also Ninja passport),
  - 3.1.3. Evidence from an authorized source of a negative result on a molecular biology test for SARS-CoV-2, the collection of which must have occurred no more than 72 hours previously,
  - 3.1.4. A physician's confirmation of SARS-CoV-2 infection survived in the last six months and confirmed by molecular biology,
  - 3.1.5. evidence of vaccination against COVID-19 with a centrally licensed vaccine.
    - 3.1.5.1. First vaccination from the 22nd day after the first vaccination, whereby this must not be longer than three months ago, or
    - 3.1.5.2. Second vaccination, in which case the initial vaccination must not have been given more than nine months previously, or
    - 3.1.5.3. Vaccination beginning on the 22nd day after vaccination for vaccines for which only one vaccination is scheduled, not to exceed nine months, or
    - 3.1.5.4. Vaccination, provided there was a positive molecular biology test for SARS-CoV-2 at least 21 days prior to vaccination or evidence of neutralizing antibodies prior to vaccination, not to exceed nine months,
  - 3.1.6. a certificate in accordance with Section 4 (18) of the EpiG or a certificate of segregation if this was issued for a person who has demonstrably contracted SARS-CoV-2 in the six months prior to the scheduled testing.
- 3.2. Each club is responsible for controlling the tests of all participants.
- 3.2.1. At the beginning of the event, a list of all persons involved in the event by the association, including name, date of birth, e-mail address and telephone number, must be handed in to the prevention officer.
  - 3.2.2. This list can also be sent electronically to [office@schwimmverband.at](mailto:office@schwimmverband.at).
  - 3.2.3. A club representative must be named to the organizer who is responsible for the Covid checks.
  - 3.2.4. ID cards and the Covid Check proofs are to be carried by each individual at all times. The prevention officer can request and check these proofs at any time
- 4. Access**
- 4.1. Entering the competition area is only allowed for top athletes according to § 3 Z 6 BStG 2017. These are all athletes participating in this meeting, their coaches and the persons necessary for the execution of the event.
  - 4.2. In case of gross violations of the prevention concept, the accreditation for the event will be withdrawn after a single warning by the COVID-19 prevention officer.
  - 4.3. Furthermore, the entire competition staff has an access authorization according to the classification for the corresponding competition section.
- 5. Management at the onset of symptoms and confirmed infections with the SARS Cov2 virus.**
- 5.1. In case of symptoms of illness of any kind (fever, cough tastelessness, etc.), the affected persons are not allowed to enter. The person has:
    - 5.1.1. to inform the COVID-19 prevention officer (point 2) about it
    - 5.1.2. to leave the sports facility immediately,
    - 5.1.3. inform the competent health authority (health hotline 1450),
    - 5.1.4. strictly follow their instructions and

- 5.1.5. report these instructions to the club management or the coach.
- 5.1.6. If a suspected case occurs outside the competition, the health authority as well as the club management or the coach AND the COVID-19 prevention officer (point 2) must be informed.
- 5.2. In the event of a positive case occurring during the event, the association must take care of the necessary measures (quarantine, transport) at its own expense, especially in the case of minors.

## **6. Leaving the competition site**

- 6.1. The competition site has to be left immediately after the last competition of a section.

## **7. Supervisor**

- 7.1. One coach/supervisor will be allowed per team for every 4 swimmers.
- 7.2. In addition, one club representative per club can be registered who is also responsible for Covid checks.
- 7.3. All accredited supervisors have unrestricted access to the entire event area.

## **8. Competition staff**

- 8.1. Assigned judges and other competition personnel have unrestricted access to the entire event area.
- 8.2. The competition staff is determined by name.

## **9. Spectator**

- 9.1. Spectators have access only to the areas assigned to them.
- 9.2. There should be no mixing of athletes or support staff and spectators.
